I want to bring a number of things to your attention with regard to the **Christmas celebrations** in our churches and **building works** in St. Philip's church.


- Please take note of the **Mass times on the Christmas eve** as well as on the **Christmas day**.
 - 24th Dec: Mountview - 5pm, 7pm & 9pm
 - 24th Dec: Huntstown - 5pm, 7pm & 9pm
 - 24th Dec: Littlepace - 5pm & 7pm
 - 25th Dec: Mountview - 8.30am, 10am & 12pm
 - 25th Dec: Huntstown - 10.30am & 12.15pm
 - 25th Dec: Littlepace - 10am & 12pm
- The number of people who can attend the Masses are limited according to the regulations.
- We **don't have a ticketing system** in any of the churches (Mountview, Huntstown & Littlepace). Our policy is **first come, first in**.
- All **Masses from Huntstown** on both Christmas eve and Christmas day **can be followed via** www.mountviewblakestownparish.ie)
- Please also **find a short prayer service below that you may use at home on the Christmas day** as a family to celebrate the day meaningfully. We encourage you to create a prayer space and nativity crib to remind ourselves of the birth of Christ and to the delight of the children.
- We encourage you **to attend a Mass during the 12 days of Christmas** (25th Dec to 6th Jan) to make up for the Christmas **Eve/Day** Mass.
- **Holy communion will be distributed** both in Huntstown and Mountview churches on the Christmas day from 1pm to 2pm to those who make a private visit to the church for prayer.

- Priests will be available in Huntstown church from 2pm to 4pm on Sunday 20th December to hear **confession**.
- We request you to support your priests by donating to the **Christmas Dues, First and Second collection** (envelopes available in the church or **via 'Donation' button** on parish website www.mountviewblakestownparish.ie). Again, please consider donating to the local parish for its upkeep during these days of dwindling income. Thank you for your support!
- **St. Philip the Apostle church is open for daily Mass** (Mon – Fri at 9.15am, Mon, Wed & Fri at 7.30pm, Sat at 10am) **and weekend Masses** (Sat 6pm, Sun 10am, 12pm & 6pm) and for private prayer. **Baptisms and funerals will not be taking place in Mountview until further notice but will be facilitated in Huntstown.**
- If you are in a position to donate to the building works in St. Philips, we encourage you to do so. Thank you for your continued support.
